CELEBRATING OUR CULTUER

One of the most famous Sicilian symbols is Teste di Moro, whose roots are deep in the culture and the history of the island. This decorative element is one example of the excellence of Sicilian ceramic. The most famous one is the one produced in Caltagirone, a small town in the province of Catania.

The history behind Teste di Moro is very interesting. It starts with a tormented love between a beautiful Sicilian girl and a young Moor boy. So, the Moor boy declared his love to the girl and she was feeling the same. She loved taking care of her aromatic plants on the balcony, which was observed by everyone.

When she realized that he had a wife back in Arabia, she was so angry that she killed him and cut his head off. The girl then used the head as a vase for her basil, and the neighbors were fascinated by it, so they asked the artisans to make some of those heads in ceramic. This tradition was preserved during the years, and nowadays teste di moro represent one of the symbols of Sicily.
