### The proposed by law change scheduled for a vote at the Sept. 9<sup>th</sup> meeting. ARTICLE I MEMBERSHIP

Section III: All members over Seventy (70) years of age shall be granted honorary membership status provided they have been a member in good standing for ten (10) years(consecutively) or more. They will pay one half of the current yearly rate for dues.

#### New:

Delete entire Section III of Article 1

#### <u> Old:</u>

**Section IV:** Membership shall not exceed 200 members. There will be a maximum waiting list of 50 proposed new members. The Membership Director will maintain applications. However, notwithstanding the above, for each and every member who qualified for half dues under Section III above, one additional new member shall be allowed membership in the Club. These members will be allowed to join the club above the normal 200 maximum limit of active members, so that the dues collected will compensate for the members entitled to pay half dues. To distinguish which new members were able to join the club in this status, they will have a member number in the 300 series.

#### New:

**Section IV:** Membership shall not exceed 200 members. There will be a maximum waiting list of 50 proposed new members. The Membership Director will maintain applications. Additional membership can exceed the 200 member cap by the number of members currently paying reduced annual dues to compensate for the dues short fall. As those members are "grandfathered out" the membership will revert back to the 200 member maximum.

#### ARTICLE II

#### DUES AND INITIATION FEES

#### <u>Old</u>

Section I: Initiation Fee - \$50.00, Yearly Dues - \$200.00, including regular monthly meeting dinners. Membership dues are payable annually, due on the 1<sup>st</sup> of January. Arrangements for alternative payment plans may be submitted to the Board of Directors for consideration and approval. Late payments will be assessed a \$25.00 charge after January 31<sup>st</sup>, if payment is not received by March 1<sup>st</sup> the member will be required to apply for reinstatement and will be re-assessed the initiation Fee of \$50.00. Effective January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2018.

#### ARTICLE II

#### DUES AND INITIATION FEES

#### <u>New</u>

Section I: Initiation Fee - \$50.00, Yearly Dues - \$250.00, including regular monthly meeting dinners. Membership dues are payable annually, due on the 1<sup>st</sup> of January. Those members that were grandfathered in at half dues will now pay \$150 yearly. Arrangements for alternative payment plans may be submitted to the Board of Directors for consideration and approval. Late payments will be assessed a \$25.00 charge after January 31<sup>st</sup>, if payment is not received by March 1<sup>st</sup> the member will be required to apply for reinstatement and will be re-assessed the initiation Fee of \$50.00. Effective January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020.

#### Ferragosto

August 15, a national holiday in Italy, marks the Feast of the Assumption, the day that the Virgin Mother ascended body and soul into Heaven. Many people in Sicily heads to the beach on August 14th, along with barbecues, picnic hampers and tents. They set up camp on the sand overnight, turning the beaches into one big, joyous campsite, rammed with people who eat quantities of barbecued food and splash into the sea at midnight to mark the start of Ferragosto proper on the 15th. They then dance through to the early hours of the morning before returning home around lunchtime the same way that they arrived.





The Assumption is also known as Ferragosto, a name that has roots in the Latin "Feriae Augustin," or Emperor Augustus' holidays, which marked a time of rest and celebration at the conclusion of the arduous growing and harvest seasons. In pre-Christian times, it celebrated the bounty provided by Mother Earth. In Christian times, it celebrates the Virgin Mother's life.
